



## Ireland's greenest hotel to share its secrets

EARLIER this year the Westport Woods Hotel was selected as the greenest hotel in Ireland following a review of the 2013 benchmarking data. On Thursday, October 2, the top hotel will host a free **green hospitality** workshop where the team will share their success story and top tips for going green and saving money.
